

## **Guidelines on Penalties for Established Cases of Cheating at Examinations/Assessments**

---

- (a) Once a cheating case in examinations is established, in the case of a Stage-based course, the student concerned is deemed to have failed all modules of his/her stage of study; or in the case of a Module Accumulation course, to have failed in all modules he/she took in that academic year. He/She is required to restudy the whole stage/all module(s) concerned.
- (b) Once a cheating case is established in an in-course assessment (e.g. continuous assessment, test, project work, etc.), the student concerned is deemed to have obtained a ZERO score for that assessment. He/She is allowed to complete the rest of the assessment(s) for the module concerned.
- (c) A student found cheating for more than one time during his/her study in IVE, irrespective of cheating in examinations or in-course assessments will be expelled from the Institute and debarred from re-admission to any IVE course for a period of 2 years.

In case a student found cheating at examination/assessment is required to restudy a stage/module(s) of a phased out course, it can be arranged for him/her to take an equivalent stage/module(s) of a similar course. If necessary, the course can be offered in another mode of study, or campus.
