We establish these Smart City Innovation Centres for students to interact with experts from industries and enterprises in Hong Kong, and at the same time, for the public to learn the innovation applications and services for the smart city development. There are many more smart initiatives in VTC in the pipeline. Stay tuned.

Second, as the Industrial Professor and Chairman of WMG School for Professional Development Steering Group of the University of Warwick, my mission is to offer a platform for students to learn, exchange ideas and knowledge locally and internationally. I shall continue my efforts to forge a closer partnership between the University and the VTC for grooming a bigger pool of talents with brilliant intellect and expertise to excel in the evolving economic landscape.
