

VTC Skills Fiesta 2025 concludes with over 17,000 participants and close to 22,000 visits exploring skills through interactive activities



With the full support of the Education Bureau, the VTC Skills Fiesta 2025 was successfully held on Sunday, 26 October 2025, at the Great Lawn in the West Kowloon Cultural District. Over 17,000 participants joined the Fiesta, with close to 22,000 visits to our activity booths, gaining hands-on and interactive experience. Themed "Infinite Fun in Everyday Life," the event features more than 40 performances and interactive booths curated by VTC staff and students, allowing the public to experience how vocational and professional education and training (VPET) is seamlessly integrated into daily life.

On the event day, Secretary for Education Dr Choi Yuk-lin officiated at the Opening Ceremony with other distinguished guests and enjoyed the fashion and image show presented by VTC talented students. Secretary Choi experienced various interactive games, and also interacted with the VTC Solar Car team, who recently won the championship at the 2025 World Solar Challenge in Australia, witnessing the fruitful outcomes of VPET.

Specially designed photo spots by HKDI students added vibrant artistic flair to the venue, showcasing the exceptional talent and professionalism of VPET students.



The stage programme was equally captivating, featuring a dazzling cocktail mixing performance by the Hotel and Tourism Institute (HTI); lively music performances by Youth College students and VTC's music brand, V Music, fostering audience engagement and connection; and a stunning fashion and image design show showcasing over 50 outfits created by students from the Hong Kong Design Institute (HKDI), the Technological and Higher Education Institute of Hong Kong (THEi) and Youth College. The grand finale was an outdoor light show presented by teachers and students of the Hong Kong Institute of Information Technology (HKIIT), which illuminated the West Kowloon night sky and brought the event to a spectacular close.
